# >> Homes for Islington Staff are to blame for these errors

Last week Dr Brian Potter asked if Homes for Islington (HfI) directors were qualified to award large maintenance contracts. The question arose after the Leasehold Valuation Tribunal slashed some leaseholder's bills by up to 60 per cent. As Dr Potter pointed out, if the leaseholders were being overcharged, so too were rent-paying tenants.

One might think that Dr Potter has asked the right question. After all, the directors did take the final decision and they did sign the contracts on behalf of HfI as a company. The reality is a bit more complex and may give us cause for thought.

The directors were essentially non-executive. meaning that they did not get involved with day-to-day work or details. This was broadly similar to elected councillors and MPs. In this sense there is no requirement for any of them to be 'qualified'. Indeed, there is no qualification for being a public representative.

All public representatives, including HfI's directors, are dependent upon the
